

Cat's Wherewithall Vest

This is a preview glimpse of my versatile, easy-to-custom-fit vest. It can be worn with the sleeve caps down or cuffed up, the collar up, with tips down, or completely folded down. And most mysterious of all, the same vest looks good on a range of body sizes—on Barbara below, the blue and silver vest is closely fitted, and on Cat, it has positive ease (garter stitch behaves like ribbing).

The Wherewithall Vest can be knit at any gauge, with the option of using multiple strands together, so you can blend things from your stash. Some knitters choose a neutral base strand to combine with colorways from their stash (any number of contrast color streaks can be added).

A Tiny Vest familiarizes you with the shaping start to finish, giving you the confidence to relax as you knit your full-size vest. The Tiny Vest also serves as a swatch for custom-fitting. And if you end up needing that yarn, you can unravel the Tiny Vest, although you won't want to, because it is so dear.
